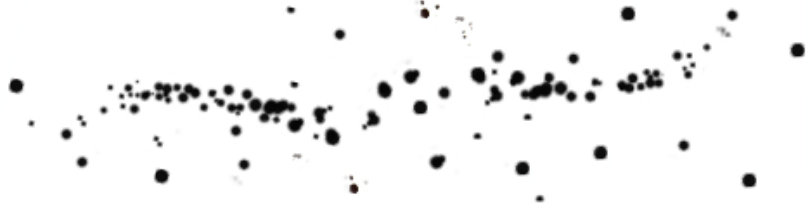

Why should I bother to vote?

Municipal government has a direct impact on arts, culture and heritage. Your vote will affect which municipal programs and services are maintained, developed, funded and managed. Your vote will even affect what attitudes are adopted in our Council chambers, how social problems are addressed and what kind of education our children experience.

Who is telling me how to vote?

Nobody! Your vote is your business.

ArtsVote Niagara is a cross-disciplinary, non-partisan network of volunteers that encourages artists, arts supporters and arts, culture and heritage workers to vote. By soliciting and evaluating candidate views, we give you information on how candidates compare to one another on arts, culture and heritage questions. You make your own choices!

How do I know I am eligible to vote?

You are eligible to vote if you are a Canadian citizen; at least 18 years old; residing in the local municipality or an owner or tenant of land there, or the spouse of such owner or tenant; and not otherwise prohibited from voting. On Election Day bring your voter notification card and identification to your local polling station. If you have not received a voter notification card, be sure to take proof of residence and citizenship with you to your local polling station.

How did you grade the candidates?

In the 2006 municipal election campaign, a survey was developed by the ArtsVote Niagara Executive Committee for distribution by email and mail to candidates running for election in St. Catharines and for Niagara Regional Council.

The survey and details about how the grades were reached are available on line at www.artsvoteniagara.ca.

What do the grades mean?

The ArtsVote Niagara 2006 grades are based primarily on candidate surveys. A cautionary note: it is one thing to excel in a survey and another to deliver on a platform that includes a collaborative, strategic and productive engagement of the cultural sector.

ArtsVote Niagara pledges to watch the incumbents carefully in the next four years. Here is a guide to help explain what the current grades mean.

- A+** **DAZZLING.** A leader who talks the talk and walks the walk. Boldly champions arts, culture and heritage issues. Fully informed and engaged. This grade is reserved for incumbents or former incumbents who have proven integrity.
- A** **OUTSTANDING.** Advocates the value of the arts, culture and heritage to municipal life. Talks the talk and offers some evidence they will walk the walk.
- B** **SOLID.** Assumes some arts, culture or heritage friendly positions. Has provided support and offered some degree of awareness of the importance of the sector.
- C** **UNFAMILIAR.** Arts, culture and heritage issues are not high on the priority list. The candidate is unfamiliar with the sector, or is reluctant to make commitments.
- D** **INADEQUATE.** Uninterested or antagonistic toward the concerns and perspectives of artists or arts, heritage and culture workers.
- R** **REMEDIAL ACTION REQUIRED.** Did not return the survey or did not complete the survey, and failed to indicate why.
- R+** **REMEDIAL ACTION REQUIRED.** Did not return the survey, or failed to complete all relevant questions, but claims to be supportive of the arts.
- R-** **REMEDIAL ACTION REQUIRED.** Did not return the survey, and expresses indifference or negative attitudes towards the creative sector.

We have not audited, reviewed or otherwise attempted to verify the accuracy or completeness of such information.

What about culture-related voting records of incumbents?

A proposal to redevelop downtown Port Dalhousie has been the most controversial arts, heritage and culture related issue during the past electoral term in St. Catharines and at Niagara Region.

There are those who believe that the development represents the best opportunity for economic revitalization in Port Dalhousie, that it is consistent with Smart Growth principles and will restore Port Dalhousie as a family friendly destination. There are those who feel it is a radical contravention of the St. Catharines Official Plan, the Heritage District Plan, the Regional Strategy for Development and Conservation, and Provincial and Federal guidelines for historic preservation. And, there are those who are concerned about the nature of the development approval process and the City’s failure to consult extensively with the cultural sector and scrutinize the development’s viability assumptions.

There are a number of reasons why candidates took the positions they did on the Port Place development. ArtsVote Niagara has not taken the candidates’ various positions into account in the grading of candidates but has chosen to present, without the nuances, the candidates’ general positions on the development:
